Recently I met a kind gentleman with friendly eyes. As we visited, I noted that he was leaning on a beautiful walking stick. The gnarled branch had been sanded smooth and polished until it shone. It felt like satin under my fingertips. As I admired it, he told me the story of how he came to own this remarkable piece of useful art. After a storm, he was cleaning up his yard. As he worked, he came upon a sizable branch that was just the right length for a walking stick. It was sturdy, and he found himself using it as he navigated the uneven terrain of his lawn. A car pulled up alongside him, and a man got out carrying a beautifully polished walking stick. He asked if he could trade, and suddenly the broken branch had been switched for a new one, and the man was back in his car and left without another word. No payment was accepted, barely even an opportunity to offer a word of thanks. Simply an unsolicited exchange of old, broken, useless for something new, beautiful, useful.

As he told me this story, I was deeply touched and reflected on how this simple act so clearly demonstrates God's love for us. "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Grace and mercy offered freely, unsolicited, without us doing a thing to deserve it. God simply took our old, broken lives and changed us into something new, something beautiful. The beautiful walking stick was simply a broken branch at one time, too. But someone took the time to sand and polish it until its natural beauty shone through. God's grace and love polishes us until our natural beauty shines through. There is nothing on earth great enough to repay that gift, the amazing grace freely poured out on each of us. But we do have the opportunity to express our gratitude, each and every day. Let your natural beauty shine for the world. Live as Jesus taught, knowing that you have been redeemed, restored, renewed.


