

Feeling Stretched as a Caregiver?

Powerful Tools for Caregivers is an educational series designed to provide you with the tools you need to take care of yourself.

This program helps family caregivers reduce stress, improve self-confidence, improve communication, balance their lives, increase their ability to make tough decisions, and locate helpful resources.

The caregiver class consists of six sessions held once a week. Two experienced Class Leaders conduct the series (many are experienced caregivers themselves, who have successfully applied the techniques they teach). Interactive lessons, discussions and brainstorming will help you take the "tools" you choose and put them into action for your life.

Participants will receive a book, *The Caregiver Helpbook*. A suggested contribution of \$25.00 for class materials.

NOW IN THE WORKS -

The **Christmas Angel Project** for Neillsville, Granton, Chili and Humbird is in place to help provide Christmas gifts, needed clothing items (i.e. winter coats, boots, sweatshirts, jeans, hats, mittens, etc.), toys, and groceries for needy children of families in these communities. A secondary mission of this project is to educate people in these communities that there are needy families in the area. We work in coordination with United Church of Christ and St Mary's Catholic Church, both of Neillsville. UCC graciously allows us to "take over" their church basement during the month of December.

(Thanks to Doris Bakker & Paul Vine for picking up the donation from the Jackson Correctional Institute) Our target population is children of needy and working poor families of Neillsville, Granton, Chili and Humbird. We have grown from serving 146 children of 48 families in 2003 to serving 235 children of 93 families in 2023!

Initially, needs/wants lists for children are distributed to Christmas trees in area organizations, churches and businesses. Volunteers collect the gifts purchased by kind individuals and organizations, wrap each gift, and deliver the gifts and groceries to each family. Volunteers also coordinate community donations of various items, e.g. handmade teddy bears/hats/mittens made by inmates at Jackson Correctional Institution. Since 2003, this effort has grown to provide winter coats, boots, groceries, hand-made (donated) blankets, teddy bears, backpacks, toothbrushes/ toothpaste, Christmas stockings and other donations. The majority of the winter coats, boots, and pajamas are purchased in January at large discounts and stored until the following December.

A large portion of the Project budget is spent on groceries. In 2023, in addition to several generous bags of non-perishable food items, we were delighted to have the funds to provide a large jar of peanut butter, two loaves of bread, small ham, one gallon of milk, and two pounds of cheese to each family. We receive donations of dog and cat food and provide it to families with pets.

The Project occurs only by the grace and contributions of many volunteers. There are no paid employees. Any and all donations are used for the kids. We are honored to include volunteers of all ages. Granton Future Farmers of America students play an integral part in packing groceries into standard bags for ease of distribution to each family. Numerous amazing individuals and service organizations volunteer their time and talents to feed the volunteers, wrap gifts, organize the items for each family, and deliver the gifts and groceries.
