<u>January Newsletter - 2024</u> Overview

Greetings to Neillsville UCC friends and family. It has been another year that has passed in a blink of an eye and here we are starting 2025.

2024 was a busy year as the pastor search process culminated in welcoming Pastor Julie Ruegsegger and husband Earnie to our church and community. She promotes a welcoming environment and is a positive inspiration to all. We also continued our traditions of supporting the community through the monthly food giveaway program, hosting the Angel Tree project for local families, supporting the backpack program and many others.

We are also fortunate to have many members who donate their time and talent to the annual holiday fundraiser. This fundraiser as well as interest from our local endowment funds helps ensure we are able to keep the lights on as well as complete necessary projects and repairs to our church facility.

As you make these things possible for our small church when we are looking to make ends meet, you always remind us of the Christian love we all share. In the past year the funds you have given made an impact on our church's foundation, our families, and the wider community.

The church council, along with the church trustees committee, oversees the church finances and attempts to keep members informed with honest and up-to-date information. In December, the congregation approved the 2025 church budget projecting a \$24,000 deficit. Annually this deficit has been made up through reduced spending of some line items as well as the generosity of our members. Many of our expenditures are fixed, such as utilities and insurance, that we have little

control over, and our trustees have been quite prudent in monitoring all expenses.

As we mentioned at the December 10 congregational meeting, we need to be proactive and consider ways to improve the financial picture through member giving, increasing membership, as well as brainstorming ideas to increase revenue.

When you review your giving amounts for 2025, please consider helping our church family. Consider inviting a friend or a neighbor to one of our services or upcoming event or fundraiser. We will initiate an ad-hoc group to help brainstorm ideas and future fundraisers. We hope to meet in early to mid-January to start the discussion.



2024 UCC Proposed Budget

JoAnn Voss stated that the Stewardship Committee members are often asked how the \$14,000 is decided for the Wider Mission budget line. Assistant Treasurer Quicker and Interim Pastor Jim stated it is determined by many factors, some including the church membership size, the amount of the giving, and how well the church is doing.

Paul Schmidt asked what specifically are the Memorial Funds used for. Assistant Treasurer Quicker stated that this money is used for special projects and helps with non-budgeted items. For example, if money was not donated towards the parking lot project through other activities of the church like individual donations, the baked goods auction, and the Holiday Fair funds, the Memorial Fund may have been used.

Mike Perkl expressed appreciation to the Holiday Fair funds for the improvements to the Fellowship Hall with the round tables and to the parking lot fund.

Motion by Mike Perkl, seconded by Russell Karl to approve the 2024 budget as reviewed and presented in written form by Assistant Treasurer Don Quicker. Voice vote taken with all "aye"; motion carried.
