The Lord is my light and my salvation— so why should I be afraid? The Lord is my fortress, protecting me from danger, so why should I tremble? Psalm 27:1

Dear Friends,

As I write to you today, I am busy preparing for Holy Week, my favorite week of the church year. Not so many years ago, Palm Sunday was all about celebration. The children waved palm branches, the congregation sang praises and shouted "Hosanna!" We celebrated the confirmation of our youth, who would then attend Maundy Thursday service and receive their first communion. Businesses would close for an hour on Friday afternoon to allow everyone to attend Good Friday services.

Over the years, the focus has changed. Confirmation rarely happens on Palm Sunday anymore, and we have become more open at the communion table, welcoming all ages, so that there isn't really an acknowledgement of first communion. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services are sparsely attended. We now worship on Palm Sunday with a full recounting of Holy Week so no one goes from "Hosanna" to "Alleluia" without the darkness in-between. As I get older, I am more acutely aware of the importance of those days, of the darkness and suffering that Jesus experienced, that *we* need to experience to fully understand the miracle of Easter.

When Jesus was arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, his disciples scattered. Many went into hiding. Peter outright denied knowing him. Few made the journey to Calvary to witness the death of their teacher and friend. We know that Mary was there to be with her son until the bitter end. We know that she watched his final moments, heard his final words, and cried out at his final breath. She wept, and she grieved. She saw him laid in the tomb, the stone rolled in front, and she left feeling defeated, devastated, afraid. She awoke Saturday morning, and the grief hit anew, as she faced the day without her beloved son, preparing to face a future without Jesus in it. She had no idea what the next day would bring.

Easter cannot be understood apart from the grief of Good Friday. The overwhelming joy of the Resurrection cannot be understood without the overwhelming sadness and shame of the Cross. We cannot fully rejoice in the light if we don't fully experience the darkness.

Lately, I often feel like there is more darkness in the world than there is light. It can be overwhelming and frightening and sometimes feels like there is simply no end in sight. But the promise of the Resurrection is alive in each of us. It is not just about life after death, but about God having the final say, the final victory over the darkness. Faith tells us that we need not fear the darkness, for God will prevail, the Light will return, the Love of God will have the final word. So, my friends, face the darkness with confidence that the Holy Spirit is with you, guiding you through, standing with you as we fight against the forces of hatred and division. No matter how dark the night, how deep the grief, just know this: Easter is coming!

Wisconsin Conference UCC Restructuring

Northwest Association pastors and delegates met at St. Paul's UCC in Wausau on March 8 to discuss the proposed restructuring of the Wisconsin Conference. The proposal is to dissolve the four associations and shift to a single middle judicatory body - the Conference - responsible for carrying out the wider mission and ministry of the United Church of Christ in Wisconsin. Although the Associations would no longer exist as we currently know them, there would be a shift to a regional designation for gatherings and support from the four conference ministers. Rev. Michael Jones, who is currently an invaluable resource as the NW Association Minister, would continue to support the northwest region.

Two values stood out when the conference staff asked people about their wider Church connections: meaningful relationships beyond the local church and more robust resources. Over the past decade the WCUCC has made significant progress in broadening digital connections and accelerating the sharing of resources. Thanks to Zoom, we have created several justice working groups. Additionally, we now have more than 20 Communities of Practice and several new resource networks including Supportive Ministries, Rural and Small-Town Ministries, Older Adult Ministries, worship resource conversations, Generosity webinars, and online Faith Formation, including confirmation available through the Damascus Project.

This web of interlocking connections across the Wisconsin Conference embraces in-person and online meetings. It invites individuals to align their passions with service to the wider Church, and it offers infinite possibilities for building relationships and sharing resources.

Our vision going forward is to continue building a network of resources to support congregational life. The most significant shift ahead will be the move of the ecclesiastical work of Committees on Ministry (also known as Division of Church and Ministry) to a unified approach across the Conference. The proposed Unified COM will have regional representation by nearly 50 volunteers in working groups dedicated to fulfilling three main ministerial functions: Authorization, Oversight and Support.

The dissolution of associations will be financially neutral because the missions and ministries carried out by associations will be carried out by the Conference. The administrative efficiencies and cost savings we gain will allow us to invest time and money into further developing relationships and resources. Our Church's Wider Mission will continue to be the primary way we fund the mission and ministry of the Conference.

Official action on the restructuring proposal will occur during the Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting, scheduled for June 6 and 7 at Green Lake Conference Center. The associations will meet in breakout sessions on June 7 to conduct final association business, to vote on dissolution and to offer a litany of gratitude and leave-taking. That afternoon, Annual Meeting delegates will vote to take on the functions of associations, with appropriate timetables established for the transition.

This is an important moment in the life of the Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ. If you are interested in being a delegate to the Annual Meeting in June, please contact Pastor Julie by May 15.

This is the second of four fundraising events planned for 2025. The other two events will be later in the year.




UCC Financial Update


